#### What is the scholarship?

This may be used to support any accredited post-high school program that awards a certificate, license or degree. Examples include, but aren't limited to: vocational programs, CDL license, cosmetology, phlebotomy, Bachelor's degree etc.

#### Who is eligible to apply? Graduating high school seniors

- enrolled in or registered with the **White Pass School District** (home school students must be registered with Intent to HomeSchool letter on file with the White Pass School District)
- with a minimum cumulative high school GPA of 2.0
- who submit a complete application packet by the deadline
- who participate in an interview with members of the scholarship committee

**Note:** Application for scholarship does not guarantee an award.

The scholarship committee will judge applicants in the following six categories. You should make sure you address these categories in your application. As long as you meet the minimum GPA of 2.0, your score in any particular area will not take you out of the running to receive a scholarship award.

- grades and academic achievement
- commitment to educational goals
- community service

- financial need and special circumstances
- school, work and community activities
- presentation of self

### White Pass Scholarship Application Packet Checklist

- Application Form Complete, signed and dated, including any pages of additional information. You can complete this form electronically on the White Pass High School website <a href="www.whitepass.k12.wa.us">www.whitepass.k12.wa.us</a> or in your own handwriting. The fillable form must be printed before submitting only complete paper applications, signed and dated by hand, will be accepted.
- ☐ **Personal letter**, typed 2 page maximum. Letter must include but is not limited to:
  - Reflection on how your life experiences have influenced you.
  - Educational goals and career path you are considering and why.
  - Statement on financial need and/or special circumstances. Include family/guardian support or challenges for your past and future educational goals.
